



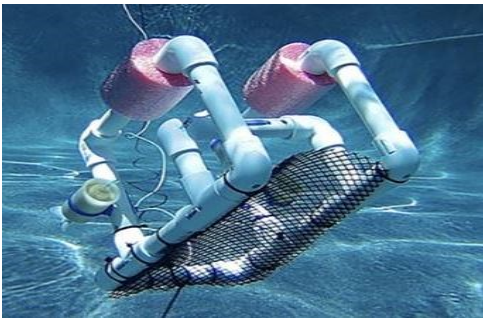

One of the projects the SST Sea Cadets will undertake is the Navy SeaPerch underwater robotics program that provides SST Sea Cadets with the resources to build an underwater remotely operated vehicle (ROV).
