
NOTES:A) Drill Fee: \$30.

B) Disposable plastic bottles are not allowed. Refillable hydration bottles such as Nalgene, Swiss Gear etc... are allowed. **DO NOT FORGET WATER BOTTLE OR CAMELBAK.**

C) Visitors. Please arrive in weather appropriate comfortable clothing. You are authorized to stay the night with the option to also depart at 2000 (8pm). If you stay the night, please bring appropriate sleeping attire, sleeping mat with sleeping bag, toiletries, and change of clothes.

D) Parade. Please ensure you arrive to drill hydrated. The parade is 1.6 miles that we will execute in formation. This should not be an issue for our Cadets. Double check all required uniform items as you should be good from the Ball. Finally, YOU MUST be within uniform regulations to participate in the event. This includes no missing items, preferable shined shoes (but at least blackened), white tshirt, etc. **If you choose to arrive outside of military grooming standards you will be asked to leave as we cannot present Alamo Battalion Cadets in front of the city of San Antonio out of standards. Additionally, we are wearing Navy uniforms at a Veteran's Day parade, please reflect on the need to be presentable and within regulations as we are honoring those who have not only worn the uniform, but sacrificed before you.** Parents - the parade observation will be viewable on Houston St. passed Soledad St.

E) Photos. We will be taking official photos in our service dress blue uniforms. League Cadets have the option of either taking a photo in NWUs or bringing a white t-shirt, white hat, and shirt to take the photo.
